- Prize money: 1st £2.50, 2nd £2, 3rd £1.50
- Cups and shields will be presented from 4pm
- · All cups and shields to be held for one year
- No exhibits should be removed before 4.30pm
- Children's classes will be judged in age bands: Under 5 years, 5—8 years and 9—11 years.

RECIPE - Date Squares

<u>Filling ingredients</u>

425g dates, pitted and chopped

250 ml water

30 ml lemon juice

2 tbsp brown sugar

1/2 tsp baking soda

<u>Crisp layer ingredients</u>

175 g quick-cooking oats

150 g plain flour

160 g brown sugar

1/4 tsp baking powder

170 g butter, softened

Preparation

With the rack in the middle position, preheat the oven to 350 °F (180 °C). Line a 20-cm (8-inch) square baking dish with a strip of parchment paper, letting it hang over two sides. Butter the other two sides of the baking dish.

Filling

In a pot, bring the dates, water, lemon juice, and brown sugar to a boil. Add the baking soda and simmer for 5 minutes, stirring constantly with a wooden spoon, or until the dates have fallen apart. Allow to cool.

Crisp

In a bowl, combine the oats, flour, brown sugar, and baking powder. Add the butter and stir to combine.

Spread half the crisp in the baking dish and press firmly. Layer with the date mixture. Cover with the remaining crisp and press lightly. Bake for 55 minutes or until the crisp is golden brown. Let to cool on a wire rack for 4 hours. Remove from the dish and cut into 16 squares.
